Undergraduate

Students enrolled in Humanities/Social Science faculties at Tohoku University's partner universities who obtained a JLPT rating of N3 or higher, or equivalent to/higher than N3 on the individual Japanese Computerized Adaptive Test J-CAT (http://www.j-cat.org/en).

Graduate

Students enrolled in institutions having a formal student exchange agreement with Tohoku University.

Graduate
