ACADEMIC PROGRAMME

English is a global language, and as such, it serves a variety of purposes for people around the world. For some, it's purely functional, for others, it's a gateway to other cultures.

In this course you will develop your functional English language skills and deepen your knowledge of British culture through a variety of lessons and workshops with our experienced tutors alongside a series of visits and trips in York and Yorkshire to put your learning into context. Specific sessions on intercultural skills will help you to explore cultural differences and strengthen your competency and communication in this area. A taster of the University's flagship York Strengths programme will assist you in enhancing your employability skills. You will have the opportunity to put the skills and knowledge you have learnt into practice through a group research project.





Aims

The aim of this programme is to develop your English language and intercultural communication skills.

In particular it helps you:

- Strengthen your English language skills through a communicative and functional language based approach
- Broaden your cultural horizons and enhance your intercultural competence
- Develop and demonstrate in-demand and transferable professional skills for your future career or studies

English Language and Culture

At the heart of the programme are 23 hours of **English language and culture** classes, designed and delivered by experienced tutors from our Global Opportunities team. Alongside language learning, you'll be introduced to various aspects of British culture and will be guided by tutors to design and conduct a **mini research project** on a related topic, putting your knowledge into practice in a final group presentation.





Complementary Skills Sessions

Complementing the English language learning are our carefully selected sessions and workshops that will help you develop important skills for success in a global workplace. These include **intercultural skills** sessions to develop competence in effective and appropriate communication with people of other cultures and a taster of the **York Strengths flagship employability programme**.

Course assignments and certificate

As part of the programme you will be assigned two pieces of work:

- An individual reflective journal
- A group mini research project and presentation

If you successfully complete the programme you will receive a Certificate of Completion from the University of York.

Free Time


The timetable includes plenty of free time for you to explore on your own and our convenient location makes it easy to travel to other places in the UK.

COLLECTIVE POWER.

Eligibility

This international programme is open to all learners aged 18+ that meet our entry requirements below.

You must have had your 18th birthday before the programme starts.

Academic requirements

Our summer school has no formal academic requirements, but we expect you to have a clear motivation for applying and enthusiasm for the subject. You will be asked to demonstrate your interest in your application.

English requirements

The programme is suitable for students who have been or are learning English as a second/foreign language.

We do not ask for proof of your English language proficiency, however to ensure all students receive the full value of the programme, applicants should have an intermediate level of English (at least around CEFR B1 or IELTS 4.5)

Accommodation and catering

If you decide to book accommodation with us, you will be staying in a single room in one of 11 colleges situated on our wonderful parkland campus. Your fellow students will be staying in the same accommodation block, but you'll be able to have privacy in your own room. Rooms have shared bathrooms (the average room:bathroom ratio is 5:1).

Accommodation includes daily breakfast but you will be responsible for arranging your own lunch and dinner. Each accommodation block has a shared kitchen and you will be provided with basic kitchen equipment on arrival. There is a small supermarket on campus as well as a variety of food outlets and cafes.

Welfare and security

York is the 2nd safest city in the UK according to industry body Get Licensed in their 2023 review.

If you need any support, guidance or assistance during your time here our friendly Summer School team are here to help and our Campus Safety team provides emergency support 24/7.

Programme fees

Apply before 29th March to take advantage of our early bird discount with a tuition fee of £1,500.

For applications received after the 29th March the tuition fee is £1,750.

The tuition fee includes all tuition and course materials, transport and entry fees for timetabled trips and visits, a welcome dinner, optional free time activities*, Wi-Fi on campus and in York city centre and a certificate of completion.

Accommodation is optional and has a fee of £550 which includes accommodation for 14 nights in a single room on campus and daily breakfast.

*some activities may have an additional cost which will be communicated on arrival.
