

Registration

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Turn it in to the Academic Affairs Section of your faculty



Withdrawal In case you would like to withdraw from classes, you need to submit the form to the Academic Affairs Section of your faculty by the date set by them.

*If this is not done, you will receive "D" which is a failing grade. Otherwise, all the withdrawals will be labeled as "E".



Grading System

- Grades: AA, A, B, C, D (Failing), E
 (Withdrawal by certain date)
- Your grades will be available online:
 - Fall semester: by End/Mar
 - Spring semester: by End/Aug

Certificate / Official Transcript will be sent around Mid/April for the Fall Semester Students and Mid/Oct for the Spring Semester Students

Insurance mandatory

Health Insurance and Medical Treatment

1. National Health Insurance

70% of the medical fees will be covered at the time of treatment.

2. Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS "GAKKENSAI")

This is an aid plan covering injuries to students in case of accidents while they are engaged in research and educational activities at the university, including lectures, experiments, the participation of school event, etc. The insured students will be paid benefits according to the degree of injuries.

3. Comprehensive Insurance for Students Lives Coupled with PAS ("GAKKENSAI") for International Students ("Inbound futai-gakuso")

This is a comprehensive insurance policy covering liability (with out-of-court settlement negotiation service), injury, illness, hospitalization, rescuer expenses, death and residual disability. All services are available in English.

Student housing

- ➤ Tohoku University is committed to providing housing to students from partner universities.
- Capacity is very limited. Please understand that a room change during your stay is <u>extremely difficult</u>.
- Residents must pay the rent and other fees by the due date. 3 month delay will result in a cancellation of the contract.
- Those who are asked to leave the dormitory will not be able to continue the program.
- The regulations and rules of your dormitory must be strictly kept.



Student housing: Basic Rules

The following conduct is prohibited in the Tohoku University dormitories:

- Subletting one's room to other individuals or changing the assignment of rooms.
- Removing or changing the placement of the furnishings or equipment in one's room.
- Possessing, consuming, supplying, or distributing any illegal substances.
- Possession or use of any weapon.
- Smoking in the dormitory.
- Engaging in noisy, disorderly, disruptive, or disrespectful behavior which interferes with the activities of others.
- Hosting overnight guests. (Visiting hours vary by each dorm)
- Keeping pets.
- Vandalizing rooms or common spaces.
- Use of kerosene heaters.

How to succeed in DBU & DBG

Do

- 1. Ask questions and come to see us.
- 2. Read email and respond.
- 3. Make a study plan ahead of time.
- 4. Interact with other students, especially Japanese students (Tutor, Buddy, etc.)
- 5. Participate in on-campus activities.
- 6. Respect rules & regulations.

Don't

- Violate customs law (possession of weapons, illegal drugs and substances, etc.) →Absolutely 0 tolerance!
- 2. Drink under the age of 20.
- 3. Change your status of residence
- 4. Cut classes unless you have an unavoidable incident such as sickness.
- 5. Drive in Japan.
- 6. Work part-time outside the university.


