The COLABS program was very well organized and provided a lot of opportunities to meet and work with many different people. It took a bit in the beginning to get started with laboratory work, but afterwards I got a lot of interesting results. The lab meetings collided with other courses sometimes, but luckily I was able to take a language class in my second semester, which improved my Japanese significantly. The presentation session at the end provided a nice overview of other people's work, but it was often very hard to understand so many different topics in such a small amount of time.



## Experiences at TU, in Sendai and Japan

All in all I had a great time in Sendai, through living in the student home and many different organized events I met a lot of people from Japan and all over the world. Even though I knew some things about Japan before spending a year there, I was often pleasantly surprised by the country and its people.
