Goal of study	<p>This course will look at certain theories of language, society, and culture with the aim of answering the following questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - What is language? / What is society? / What is culture? - What are the overall view, methods, and goals suggested by the particular theory? - What is its historical and intellectual background? - What is its position in the history of linguistics? - What are its competing theories?
