Tohoku University has firmly adhered to its "Open Door" policy. It was the first Japanese university to accept female and international students, and that liberal tradition has certainly continued to this day.

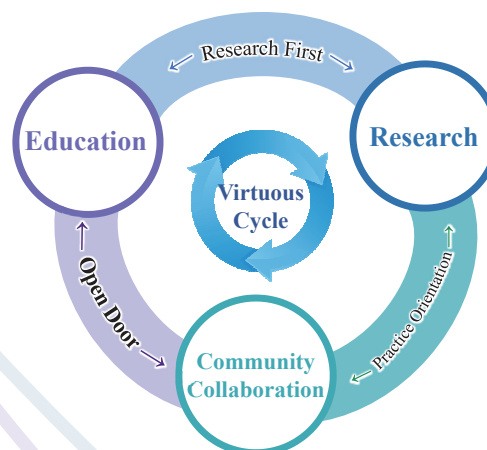

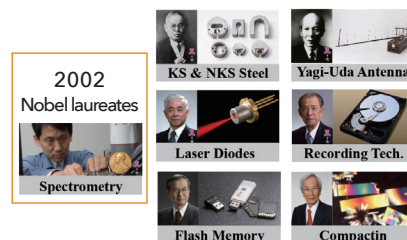

The Great East Japan Earthquake

Recovery and Reconstruction Activities

The Great East Japan Earthquake occurred on March 11, 2011 and had a magnitude of 9.0, the largest ever recorded in Japan. It inflicted extensive damage on the university and the surrounding Tohoku region. However, we were able to ensure student safety and fortunately there were no human losses on our campuses. We worked hard to restore the university's educational and research infrastructure, and were able to start the new academic year two months later. The university is deeply grateful to all those in Japan and abroad who provided encouragement and timely relief efforts.

Tohoku University Institute for Disaster Reconstruction and Regeneration Research

The Tohoku University Institute for Disaster Reconstruction and Regeneration Research was established in April 2011 to consolidate, disseminate, and implement university-wide efforts related to research, education, and social contributions aimed at recovery from the Great East Japan Earthquake. As a university located in the center of the affected area, Tohoku University has a historic mandate to exert every effort toward reconstruction. In cooperation with the local and national government, the university is developing eight projects and over 100 action plans to lead the reconstruction of the Tohoku region and the revitalization of Japan.

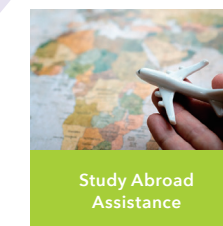

Responding to the "new normal" required by our times, Tohoku University is working to lead innovation in the global community. As part of this effort we have founded Be Global, a new project to assist international education. Be Global will address the obstacles that the COVID-19 pandemic poses to international exchange, study abroad, and collaborative/experiential active learning while extending learning/living assistance to students striving to realize their potential as global leaders. In doing so, it will construct a new model for further developing international education support systems at Tohoku University.

Intercultural Collaborative Learning for Local & International Students

Intercultural Collaborative Learning Project

Among Tohoku University's efforts to promote internationalization in education, Intercultural Collaborative Learning (ICL) has been a leading initiative domestically and abroad. ICL aims to lead the way to learning experiences that generate new values while using meaningful interaction to foster mutual understanding among students of different linguistic and cultural backgrounds. In the 2019 academic year, over 1,100 students experienced this interaction through the roughly 70 ICL classes offered in our General Education curriculum. This project expands the ICL scheme to incorporate online interactions, providing a virtual learning space that transcends geographical location and creates an opportunity for learning that includes an even more culturally diverse cohort of students.

Digital Global Education Program

FGL Course/Digital Globalization Project

This is a pilot project for implementing future online promotion (PR), admissions, support, and education at Tohoku University. We will establish, expand, and develop the following four items in our Future Global Leadership Undergraduate Courses (FGL). These will contribute to the recruitment of exceptional international students, improvement of educational opportunities for FGL and Japanese students, development of international perspective, and the fostering of global leaders.

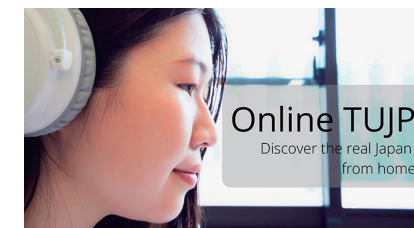


- I. Preparation of educational resources (infrastructure, learning materials, teaching methods, etc.)
- II. Implementation of FGL Pre-enrollment Education
- III. Expansion of subjects offered in English through adopting English language education and classes taught in English in cooperation with overseas partner schools and Japanese universities
- IV. Development of STEM (co-learning) classes to attract humanities students

Tohoku University Online Short Program Development Project

We will develop and implement an online version of the Tohoku University Japanese Program (TUJP), which is an inbound short program that was formerly conducted on campus. By conducting this program online, we can offer learning opportunities to overseas students who cannot study abroad due to various circumstances and to Tohoku University students who desire interaction with international students. Our goal is to build an international educational environment that will attract excellent students from abroad, and contribute to the nurturing of global professionals among our existing students. To achieve these aims, the project will implement the following two policies.

International Student Support

International Student Support via the Peer Support Project

This project will provide international students an even greater level of fine-grained support by establishing a mutual student support (peer support) system for the pandemic and post-pandemic periods. It will evolve along with the new mixed offline/online lifestyle required by the times, contributing to the internationalization of our university. Moreover, it will further foster global professional skills among students involved in providing support to international students. To achieve these aims, the project will implement the following three policies.



I. Activities

The Student Friendship Association is a university-wide organization consisting of 51 sports and 28 cultural clubs. The university also provides facilities for extracurricular activities. The environment is conducive to international exchange activities in both academic and daily life.



II. Culture

Tohoku University offers educational opportunities for students to develop intercultural competency and gain an understanding of Japanese culture. As a leader in the internationalization of higher education in Japan, Tohoku University has the largest numbers of intercultural co-learning classes among national universities in the country. Through group work and projects, international students and local students have meaningful interaction and deepen their mutual understanding. Furthermore, intellectual exchanges between professors and students, as well as hands-on participation in local festivals and community events, are integral parts of the international experience at Tohoku University.

III. Student support

Tohoku University provides various kinds of support and services to help international students lead a pleasant life in Japan. In addition to a general orientation for new international students, many undergraduate/graduate schools hold specialized orientations for the students in their programs. There is also a "Welcome Week," open to any who wish to attend, that conducts various programs to help international students adjust to life in Japan.

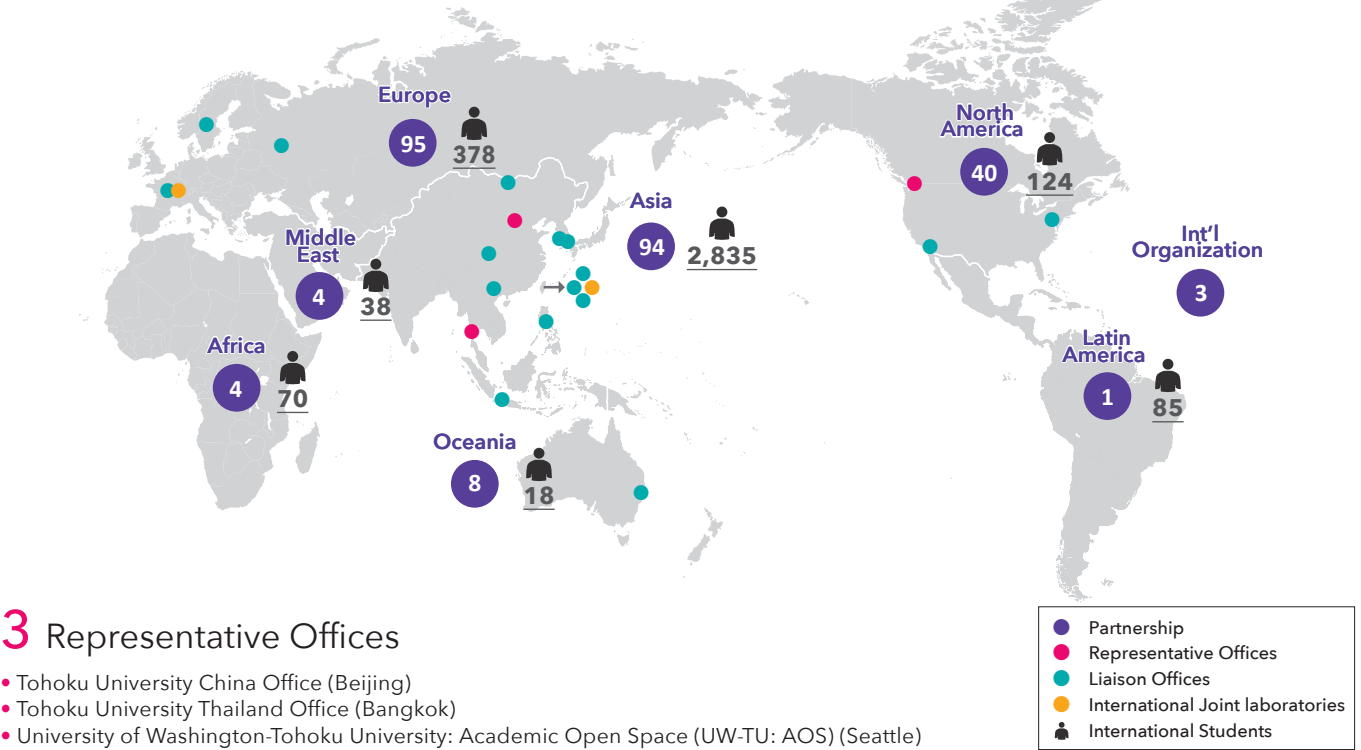

It brings together two of the world's high-tech countries facing similar challenges in society such as Global Change and Adaptation. Tohoku University will host the next Presidents' Meeting in fall 2021.

Its aim is to further knowledge exchange and research collaboration between institutions and individuals. This group of leading research-intensive universities in the two countries will also develop collaborations with industry, governments and society to address global research challenges. The six participating Japanese universities are Osaka, Kyushu, Kyoto, Tohoku, Nagoya and Ritsumeikan. From the United Kingdom, the five members are Edinburgh, Southampton, Newcastle, Leeds and Liverpool.

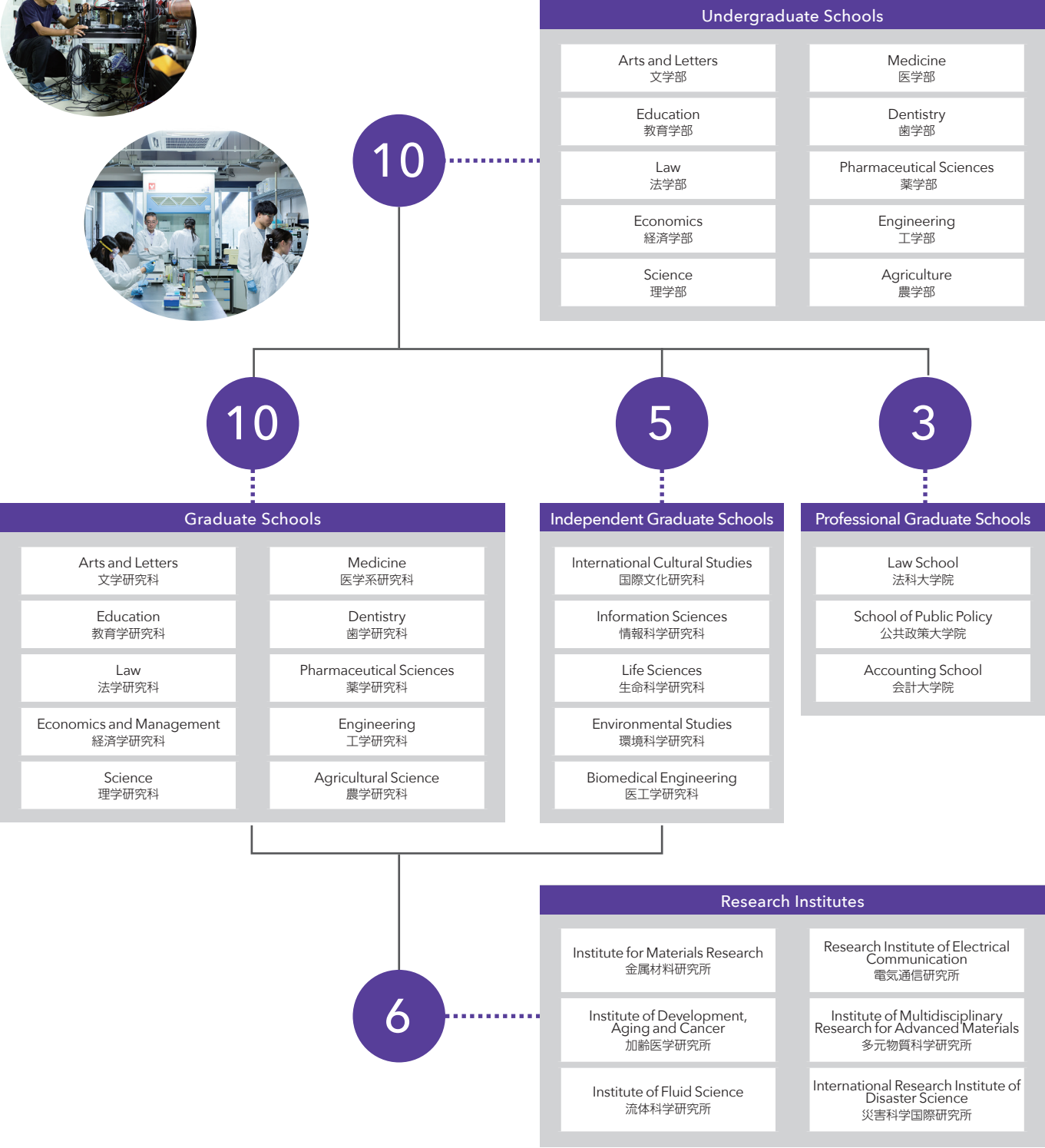
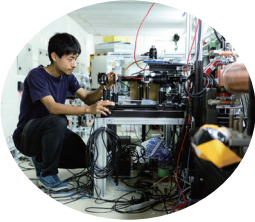


Studying at Tohoku University

At Tohoku University, students are able to study and research in a wide range of fields. Undergraduate programs cover 10 fundamental fields of specialization-4 in the humanities and 6 in the sciences. Moreover, they will be able to further increase their specialization in 18 graduate schools in expanded fields, enabling them to pursue research in cutting-edge areas. As a world-class "research university," we are striving to foster the next generation of researchers and leaders in close cooperation with our affiliated institutes and facilities.

Classes for degree courses taught in Japanese, which you can take together with local students, begin in April. Degree courses taught in English start in October. The courses taught in English are attended by international students from a variety of countries. The number of international coeducational classes open to all students is also being increased, allowing you to take classes taught in English alongside local students and providing many chances for you to study the Japanese language.

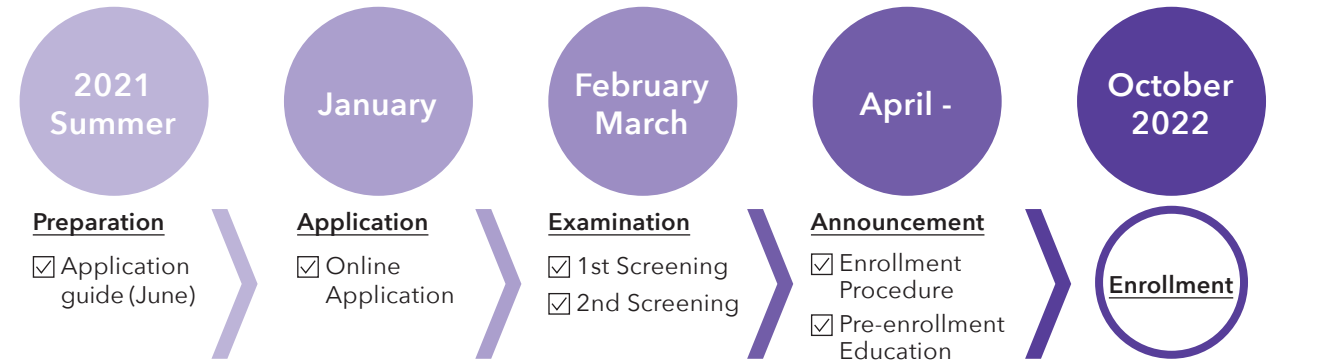

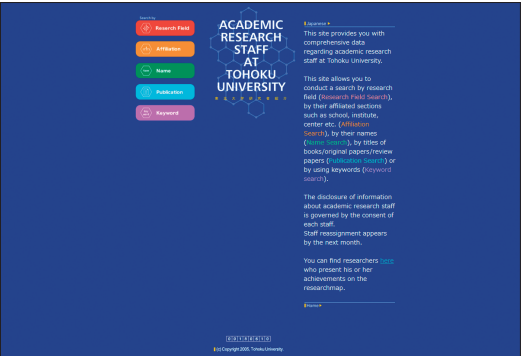

Non-degree Programs

非正規生

Research Students

Tohoku University also actively recruits short-term non-degree international students, i.e. research students. In general, research students receive guidance for their research under an academic advisor. Some students enter as research students to receive academic guidance before applying to a degree-conferring program.

How to apply

To become a research student, you should first find a professor to be your academic advisor, and contact him/her directly. (This is similar to the graduate school application procedure.) Once you have found an academic advisor, you should undergo application procedures for the relevant faculty/graduate school. You may apply to a wide range of departments at Tohoku University, including faculties, graduate schools, and research institutes.

As a research student, you must pay the designated examination, admission, and tuition fees. The term of study for research students is no more than one year.

Special Auditing Students and Special Research Students

Exchange students will be admitted to Tohoku University as Special Auditing Students or Special Research Students as per the exchange agreement.

Short-term Visiting Trainees

This status is given to students who receive training at Tohoku University for more than 3 days but less than 90 days. Students from countries having a visa waiver agreement with Japan usually do not obtain a student visa/student residential status. They are not "registered" students.

Japanese Language Program at Kawauchi for International Students and Scholars

東北大学日本語教育プログラム（外国人留学生等特別課程）

Section for Japanese Language Education

The Japanese Language Program at Kawauchi for International Students and Scholars aims to improve the participants' Japanese comprehension, and academic skills, while helping them adjust to their new living environment. The program is organized by the Institute for Excellence in Higher Education (IEHE) and held on Kawauchi Kita Campus. Japanese levels are numbered 1 (beginner) through 6 (advanced). Students can select classes matching their levels on a range of subjects, such as comprehensive Japanese, reading, listening, writing, usage, kanji, etc. Students in level 4 (intermediate) or higher can participate in International Co-learning Seminars on a variety of topics together with local students. Students in level 5 (upper intermediate) or higher can take seminars on Japanese culture.

研究生

東北大学では、学位を取得しない短期の留学生も積極的に受け入れています。研究生として、指導教員の下で研究指導を受ける制度が一般的です。また、学位を取得する課程に入学する前に、指導を受けるために研究生となることがあります。

研究生になるには、大学院入試と同様に、はじめに指導を受ける教員を探し、直接教員に受入を依頼します。指導教員が決まったら、各学部・大学院などへ出願の手続きをとります。研究生は、東北大学の学部・大学院のほか、研究所などで広く受け入れられています。出願・入学には所定の検定料・入学科・授業料を払う必要があります。在学期間は1年以内です。

特別聴講学生・特別研究学生

本学が世界各国の高等教育機関と締結する大学間交流協定等に基づき在籍する交換留学生は、特別聴講学生又は特別研究学生として区分されます。

特別訪問研修生

3日以上90日未満の期間、東北大学で研修を行う場合の東北大学での身分です。通常、日本のビザ免除国では留学ビザ・留学の在留資格は取得しません。

Financial Aid

Since these programs are based on exchange agreements between Tohoku University and the students' home institutions, tuition fees are waived for exchange students. Although the students themselves should bear the cost of living, they are eligible to apply for the JASSO Student Exchange Support Program (Scholarship for Short-term Study in Japan), which provides an allowance of 80,000 yen/month for the duration of study. Applicants will be asked to indicate their intention at the time of application.

This program is aimed at international students who want to find full-time employment within Japan through collaboration between local industry, academia, and government. Its goal is to develop human resources ready to hit the ground running and play a role in Japan's future economic development. Throughout the year, we hold various seminars online to learn about job hunting in Japan.

① Japanese Language and Career Education

Learning business-level Japanese and developing an improved understanding of Japanese business culture and organizational culture can prove valuable when trying to find full-time employment at Japanese companies. Job hunting in Japan requires filling in entry sheets, going to interviews, and more, all of which require Japanese communication ability.

② International Coeducation and PBL

Working alongside Japanese students to solve problems at companies is a great way for everyone to learn about each other's ways of thinking and values. This can be a great chance to make Japanese friends, who can share information that could come in handy when looking for full-time employment later on.

③ Internships

Experience work firsthand at a Japanese company, with instructions beforehand on business etiquette and personal goal-setting, as well as a follow-up review. Internships can help with establishing a career path and making decisions about the life you hope to lead in Japan.

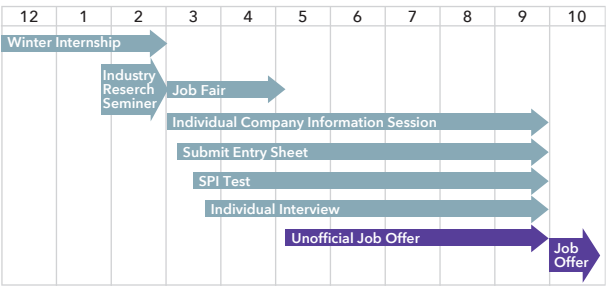

Combining the convenience of a modern city with abundant natural scenery, Sendai, where Tohoku University is located, is often called "the City of Trees." There are seasonal events throughout the year, attracting tourists from around the nation and local residents alike. Sendai is situated between the ocean and mountains with easy access to hot spring spas, ski resorts, and the scenic coastal islands of Matsushima.

Art

There is an impressive variety of museums, galleries and concert halls. Sendai offers rich collections of art from all around Japan and overseas.

Sports

The city of Sendai offers its guests and residents a broad variety of cultural activities. The games of the city's own professional baseball, soccer, and basketball teams are among the most popular events.

Climate

Sendai is characterized by a very moderate climate, yet you can experience the beauty of the four seasons. Summer temperatures sometimes exceed 30°C, but the average year-round climate is a relatively pleasant 14°C. In winter, temperatures below -3°C and snowfall of a meter or more are very rare.

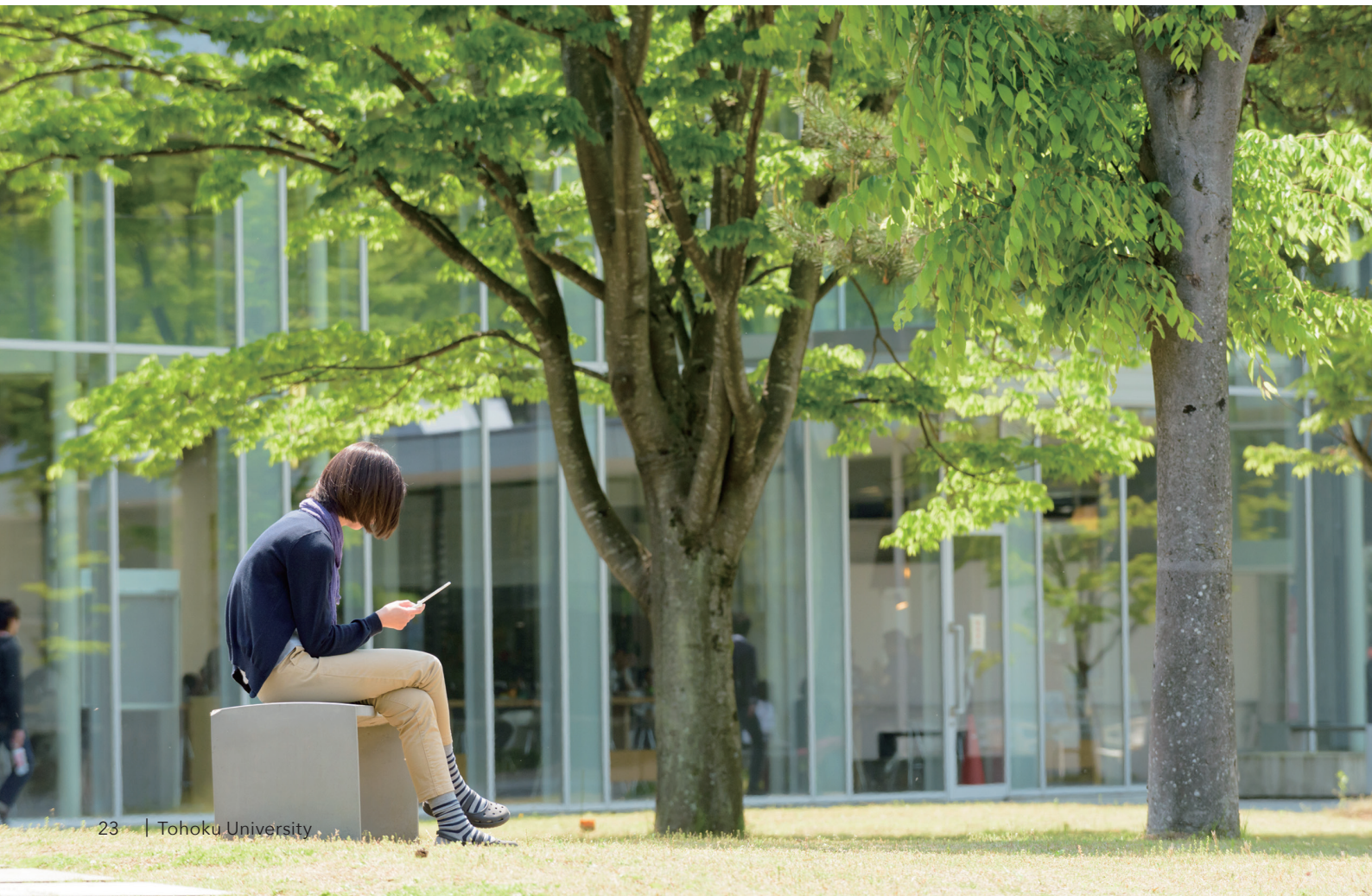
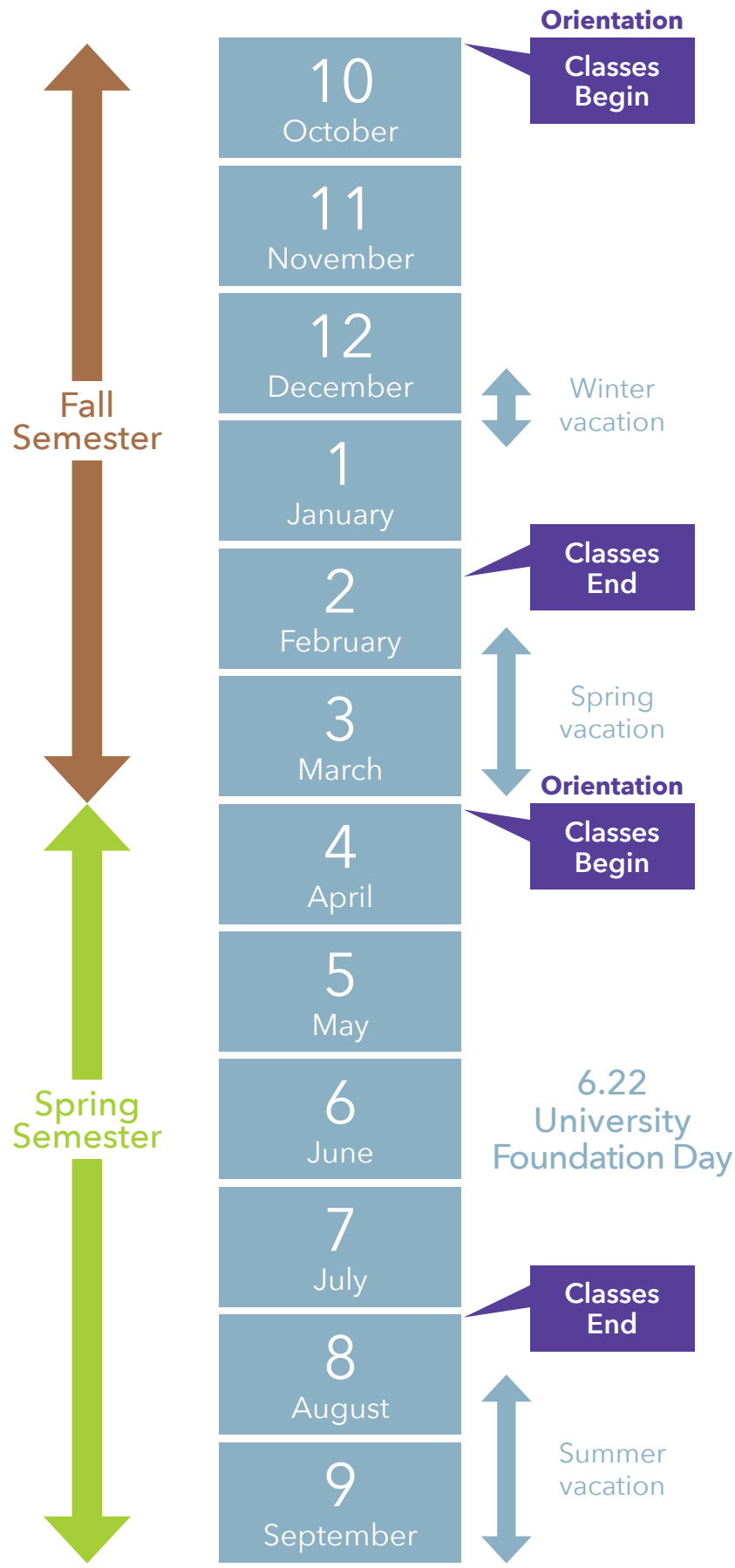
博物館、美術館、コンサートホールなどの施設も充実しており、音楽、演劇、芸術、歴史の世界に触れることができます。

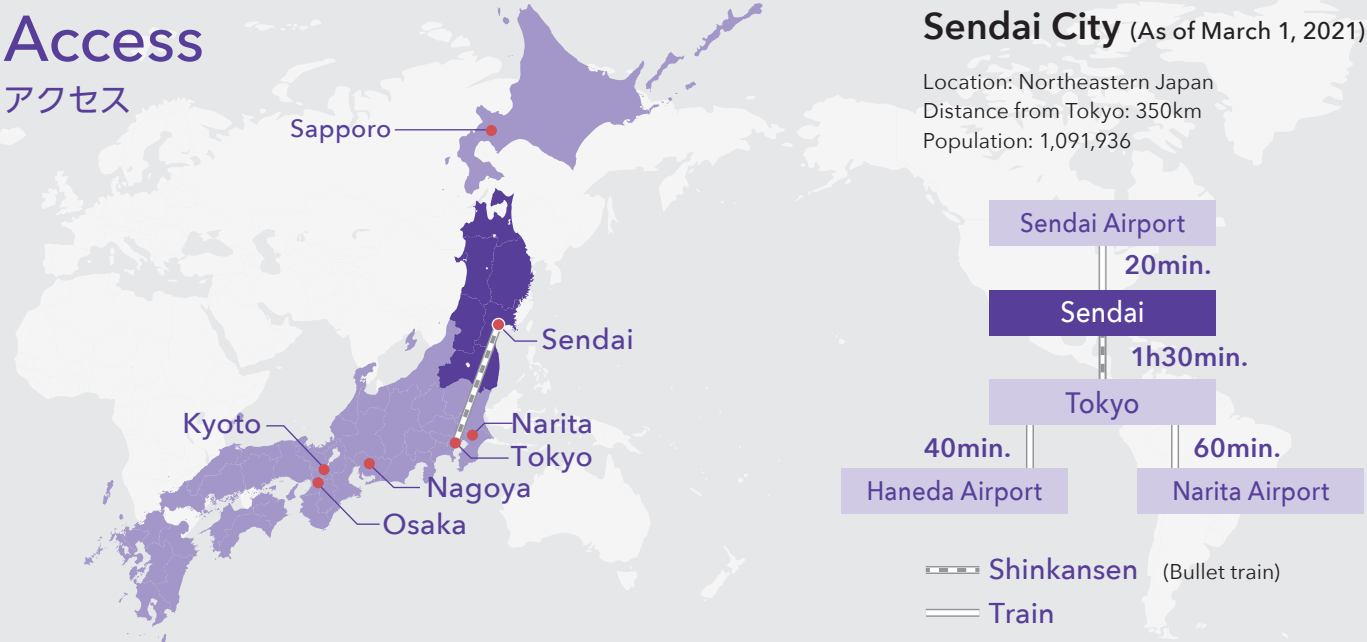

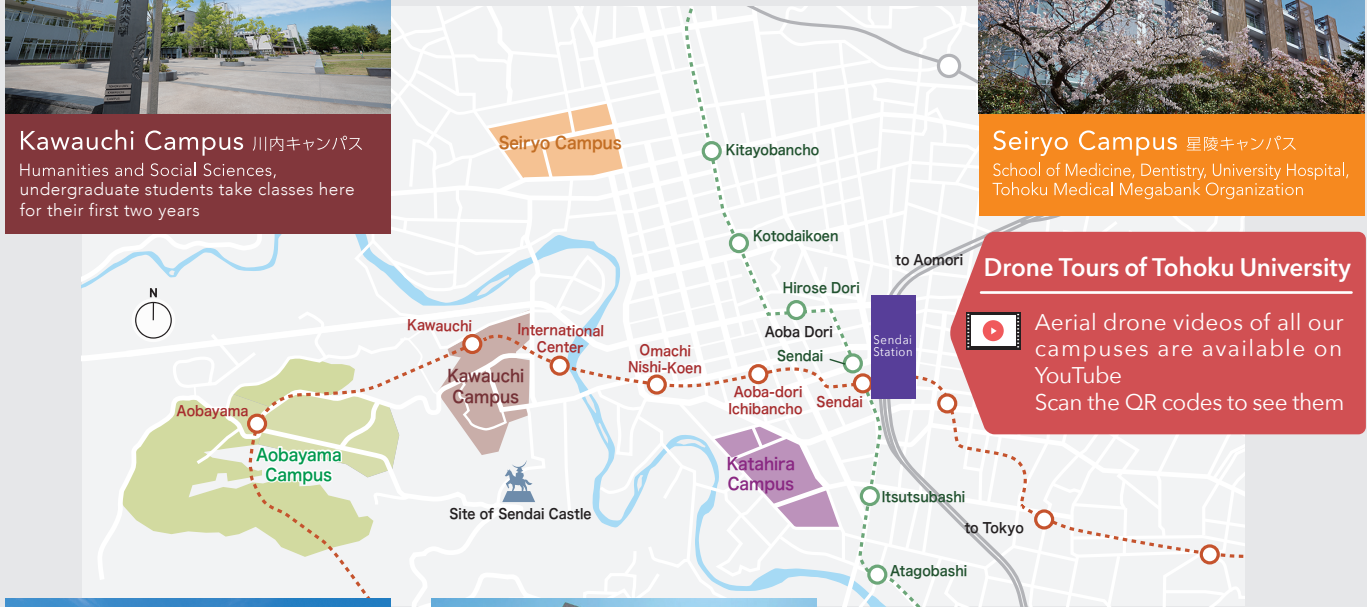

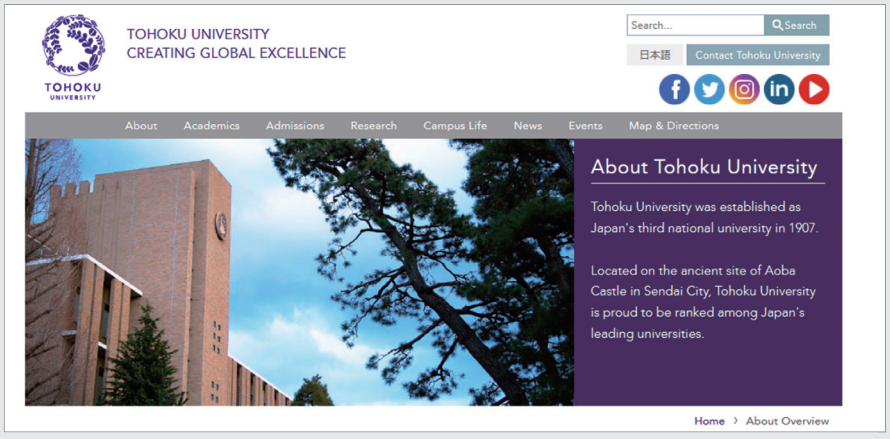
