④ 授業題目 /Class Subject	Universities in Japan and the World
④ 授業の 目的と概要 /Object and Summary of Class	This course is intended to generate a comprehensive understanding of the global context of universities in Japan and the world. Universities and higher education play an essential role in contemporary knowledge-based societies. At the same time, the characteristics of current universities are inevitably linked with their historical contexts, issues of access and equity, and mobility perceived as brain gain/drain and brain circulation. This class covers the following topics: (1) historical origins and current trends of higher education, (2) access, equity and finance in higher education, (3) knowledge economy and higher education, and (4) international dimensions of higher education. Across these topics, participants are expected to examine the role and value of universities in Japan and the world. This class provides a good opportunity to understand the international context of your university life.
④ 学修の 到達目標 /Goal of Study	This course aims at the acquisition of basic knowledge, perspectives, and skills for making the most use of the learning experience at universities in the international context. Through active participation in presentations and discussions, students are expected to acquire English communication skills in a multicultural setting, methodologies of comparative studies, and critical thinking skills.
