授業の ● 目的と 概要	This online course will be conducted synchronously ("real time") through Google Classroom. This class is designed for students who are not native English speakers and aims to develop skills essential for academic writing. Through lectures and hands-on activities, the course covers topics including critical reading, the academic writing style, how to organise an argument, and plagiarism. This class combines lectures with in-class activities including hands-on exercises and discussions. While learning some basics of writing through lectures and exercises, students should contribute to discussions, both whole-class and in pairs.
