④ 授業題目 /Class Subject	【展開ゼミ】Society and Language Education in Japan
④ 授業の 目的と概要 /Object and Summary of Class	This course aims to provide academic and practical opportunities for students to learn about Japanese society and its education through lectures, group discussion, and a project. In this course, students will learn the characteristics and contemporary issues of the Japanese education system by focusing on language learning. Students are expected to develop a comparative view of education/learning systems and practices between Japan and their home country.
④ 学修の 到達目標 /Goal of Study	After completion of this course, students are expected to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - describe distinctive characteristics of schools in Japan and their education/learning environments, especially at the primary and secondary education levels. - build his/her own views by comparing differences and similarities in societal and educational environments between Japan and students' home countries. - acquire skills to construct their own ideas by reflecting their thoughts and listening actively to peers' views.
④ 授業内容・ 方法と 進度予定 /Contents and Progress Schedule of the Class	This course consists of lectures, discussion, dialogue and group work. Sessions are held online or face-to-face. Basically, the course uses the 2nd period (10:30 am-12:00 pm) of Thursdays. Through lectures and discussions, students will learn the basic education system of Japan and other countries, its characteristics, trends, internationalization and challenges. Some lectures and related materials are provided prior to the sessions so that students can actively participate in discussions in real-time sessions. ④ 成績評価 方法 /Evaluation Method	Emphasis is put on your class participation. Assessment of your performance will be determined as follows: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Attendance and class participation: 40% Attendance of all sessions, active participation in class discussions, and performance in weekly assignments are evaluated. Every student will be allowed one excused absence with unavoidable reasons. Two late arrivals (10 minutes or more) on sessions will be equal to one absence. Three missed classes will equal to a failing grade. Please be advised that students absent from classes more than three times will not receive course credits. If a student wishes to be excused from a class due to unavoidable reasons, such as illness or a family emergency, it is the responsibility of the student to inform the instructor of the absence by email as soon as possible (preferably before the expected absence). Students are responsible for ensuring that their schedule allows them to come to class on time. Students who miss a class should contact the instructor by email in order to get the assignment of the session. 2. Project: 30% Each student will participate, prepare, and present the project regarding the education system and society that is discussed, constructed and developed through the course activities. Students should use presentation software (e.g. Powerpoint) and other materials/devices as needed for the presentation. The instructor will provide more guideline regarding the presentation format at sessions. 3. Final Paper Assignment: 30%

	<p>Students will write the comparative analysis of education policies, systems, and practices between Japan and their home country. Specific topics can be chosen by their academic concern, while the paper should include findings and insights from study of the course and any available resources with the proper use of citations.</p> <p>The final paper assignment should be up to 8 pages in length, in addition to a bibliography and any applicable appendices, and be word-processed. Use a standard 12-point font size of the Times New Roman style on every other line (double-spaced and 23 lines per page) of A4-sized paper. The final paper assignment will be evaluated based on conciseness, completeness and the concluding treatment of your research question. The final paper assignment must be submitted by the specified due date to the instructor. No late hand-ins will be accepted for any reason.</p> <p>Grades for the course will be assigned as follows: AA..... Excellent (90-100%) A..... Good (80-89%) B..... Fair (70-79%) C.....
