- You can take the SPOT exam using the link (TTBJ:TSUKUBA TEST- BATTERY JAPANESE) below.



you are eligible for the class.

- Please understand that you may be deemed ineligible depending on the number of applicants and your level.
- Eligibility decisions will be announced in late September.

Grading

The grading scale for this program is as follows.

AA	Excellent (90-100 points).
A	Good (80-89 points).
В	Average (70-79 points).
С	Passed (60-69 points).
D	Failed (0-59 points).
Е	Withdrew from the class.

Official certificates/transcripts will be sent to your university in April.

- Please attend all classes. In particular, make sure to attend the first class.
- If you must be absent from class, inform the instructor directly.
- If you do not attend at least two-thirds of the total number of classes, you will receive a "D" (fail).
- Evaluation methods vary depending on the class.



If you wish to withdraw your registration for a class, you must do so during the shown period. You must inform the Program Coordinator.


Fall Semester
