④ 授業題目 /Class Subject	History of the Japanese Language II	
④ 授業の 目的と概要 /Object and Summary of Class	In this class, we will study the basics of Classical Japanese grammar by reading an assortment of texts from the various periods of the Japanese language. We will start with a brief overview of Classical Japanese grammar and syntax, after which we will go through each major period of the classical language (Old Japanese, Early Middle Japanese, Late Middle Japanese and Early Modern Japanese) in order, reading excerpts from famous works of literature from each period.	
④ 学修の 到達目標 /Goal of Study	The goal of this course is to help students gain the basic skills necessary to read and comprehend Classical Japanese and, at the same time, introduce students to a wide variety of Classical Japanese literature.	
④ 授業内容・ 目的・方法 /Contents and progress schedule of class	概要	The first five weeks of this class will consist of lectures on Classical Japanese grammar and syntax, followed by five weeks of practice reading assignments. Students will also be given a number of reading assignments to complete as homework. The last five weeks will consist of student presentations, in which students will be placed into groups of two or three, depending on class size, and asked to present a grammatical analysis and translation of a short excerpt (about 10 lines or so) of a Classical Japanese text of their choosing to the class.

教科書および参考書 /Textbook and references	There is no assigned textbook for this class. Instead, students will be given PDFs of papers on Classical Japanese and Classical Japanese literature as well as several short excerpts of Classical Japanese texts to read for homework each week.
授業時間外学修 /Preparation and Review	In the first half of the class, students will be assigned readings related to Classical Japanese and Classical Japanese literature each week for homework and are required to actively engage in an online discussion about the class and reading assignments with their classmates and instructor. In the second half of the class, students will need to prepare for their presentations in class.
その他 /In addition	This class will be conducted live, both in person and over Zoom for students who cannot enter Japan. While this class is conducted in English, students are free to present in Japanese and submit all assignments, including the final exam, in Japanese.
