授業の 目的と概要 /Object and Summary of Class	An exploratory culture course, Japanese Culture A is offered for foreign students to learn about and share insights into various aspects of the living culture of Japan. The course comprises three basic approaches: discussing certain cultural characteristics of the nation; reading some representative literature; and conducting fieldwork at venues of cultural significance. Students can sign up with either Japanese Culture A or Japanese Culture C. In large part, the course contents of both classes alternate between fall and spring semesters. Those students who are here only for the fall semester can sign up with one class but may join fieldwork activities of the other class if there are openings available.						
学修の 到達目標 /Goal of Study	Students will gain a new perspective of the culture of this nation by examining the interconnection of various elements including the history and culture of Tohoku Region, rebuilding effort from the 2011 earthquake and tsunami, as well as the intent to reach out to the rest of the world.
