

Advice for Tutor & Tutee


- Meet your partner regularly. In order to do so, you both need to make the meeting as part of your routine. Ex) Set up a "fixed time" to meet.
- Be on time when you meet. If you will be late for an appointment, notify your partner right away. Avoid a last minute cancelation.
- Be reminded that you two do not share a mother tongue. In order to avoid misunderstanding, ask for clarification and be patient.
- Use writing to confirm your next meeting day and time to avoid miscommunication.
- Your tutor may not be able to help you every time you need help. Find an alternative way to solve your problem such as asking your friends or IPLANET members.

Succeed in IPLA?

Requirements for Completion

Spring 2024

- 15 credits including 4 mandatory credits from the ICL Courses (=Intercultural Collaborative Learning Courses)
- Submission of slides and attendance at the final presentation
- ✓ 15 credits must be taken from the IPLA curriculum (including Japanese classes)
- Except for the students assigned to the Japanese level at 5, 6 (refer to Slide No. 17)
- Credits earned from ICL courses offered by other national universities can be included for the requitements.
- Make sure you attend your first class, as enrolments may be drawn by lottery.

✓ 15 credits must be completed before taking classes other than the IPLA curriculum.

- Permission from the class instructor is required if you take courses other than the IPLA curriculum.
- <u>Credit cannot be earned</u> for the classes as you will be participating as an auditing student.

✓ Graduate School Classes

- Permission from the class instructor is required.
- There is no guarantee that students will be able to take graduate level courses, as the class instructor chooses who takes the courses.
- <u>Credit cannot be earned</u> for the classes as you will be participating as an auditing student.

Academic Issues

Grades & Transcripts

- Grading Scale used at TU: AA, A, B, C, D & E
- Your grades in the spring semester will be available online by the end of September.
- You need your Tohoku Univ. ID/Password to check your grade <u>online</u>. Make sure to keep the ID.

Official Certificates/Official Transcripts will be sent to you and your university by email in End/Oct.



How to succeed in IPLA

Dos

- 1. Ask questions and come to see us.
- 2. Read IPLA-related email and respond.
- 3. Make a study plan ahead of time.
- 4. Interact with other students, especially Japanese students (IPLANET, Buddy, etc.)
- 5. Participate in on/off-campus activities.
- 6. Respect rules & regulations.
- 7. Come out from your comfort zone as much as possible.



How to succeed in IPLA

Don'ts

- Violate customs law (possession of weapons, illegal drugs and substances, etc.) →Absolutely 0 tolerance!
- 2. Drink under the age of 20.
- 3. Smoke on campus
- 4. Cut classes unless you have an unavoidable incident such as sickness.
- 5. Work part-time outside the university without permission from us.
- 6. Neglect notifications from public offices.
- 7. Stick to your cultural group all the time.



How to succeed in IPLA

Driving in Japan

- Japanese police normally can't speak English, so you get into trouble when accidents happen.


