

★You can:


- Practice your Japanese /review lessons together

To maintain good friendship

- Meet your partner regularly. In order to do so, you both need to make the meeting as part of your routine. Ex)
 Set up a "fixed time" to meet.
- Be on time when you meet. If you will be late for an appointment, notify your partner right away. Avoid a last minute cancelation.
- Be reminded that you two do not share a mother tongue.
 In order to avoid misunderstanding, ask for clarification and be patient.
- Use writing to confirm your next meeting day and time to avoid miscommunication.
- Your tutor may not be able to help you every time you need help because the tutor is also a student. Respect each other's schedule and priority.


