### Characteristics of IPLA classes

ICL classes: Students are expected to be active in group projects/discussions and be good team-workers.

Liberal Arts classes: These are offered by departments of Social Science and Humanities. An instructor may ask if you have adequate language proficiency

Japanese language classes: They are designed to help you acquire Japanese with a systematic curriculum. The classes advance faster than what you are used to.

IPLA graduate level classes: Permission from the class instructor is required. The instructor may ask you about your prerequisite info. Some classes have quota for IPLA.



### **Expectation as students**

### Active engagement in learning community:

Most of the classes, especially ICL and Japanese language classes, require you to be present in class. If your health condition prevents you from attending a class, let your instructor know before the class begins. For students who have been in poor academic performance for a certain period of time, we will consult with the home institution and work together with them to find a solution.

### **Academic honesty and misconduct:**

Tohoku University expects all students to uphold <u>academic honesty</u>. We have <u>strict penalties for cheating on tests and plagiarism</u> in the preparation of reports and presentations.

### Consultation with academic advisors:

If some unexpected situations or circumstances keep you away from attending classes, **talk to your academic advisor immediately**.



# **FAQ**

### Q-A1. Why is this requirement set?

→ The requirement is set by the IPLA committee to maximize your learning outcome as an exchange student and also to satisfy **10 hours/week requirement** regulated by the law. If you struggle with this requirement, your academic advisor will request a meeting where your continuation with IPLA will be discussed.

### Q - A2. Should I register for 15 credits per semester then?

→We <u>strongly recommend</u> that you register for more than 15 since some students <u>fail or decide to drop</u> a class/classes.

# Q-A3. What if I want to take classes outside the IPLA curriculum?

→You are allowed to take non-IPLA classes only after meeting the 15 credit requirement. Non-IPLA graduate level classes are <u>auditing only.</u> You <u>cannot earn credits</u>.

### Q-A4. What if I don't complete IPLA?

→We expect all students admitted to IPLA to compete the program. Extensive support will be provided to navigate you to success. So stay connected to your academic advisor.



# **FAQ**

### Q-A5. What if the class I registered is not for me?

→ You can withdraw it if it's before the withdrawal deadline.
If it's after the deadline, you will receive "D", a failing grade.
Make sure not to go lower than 15 credits.

### Q - A6. Should I register for 15 credits per semester then?

→We <u>strongly recommend</u> to register for more than 15 since some students <u>fail or decide to drop</u> a class/classes.

### How to find/choose classes

Step 1: Check classes offered this semester

→https://www.insc.tohoku.ac.jp/english/ipla-course-information-2025-spring/

**Step 2**: Go to IPLA classroom (code: 7szagm2) to see class descriptions of some ICL classes or the Google classroom of each class by using the classroom code.

**Step 3**: Visit classes from Apr. 8 to Apr. 21. Some classes such as Japanese traditional culture fills quickly. Since a lottery will be used to select students, you need be in the first class.

Step 4: Meet with your academic advisor and ask questions.

Important: If you want to change your level of your Japanese language class, submit the form by Apr. 14.

### **Academic Counselling**

Academic advisor will go over your study goals and credits to take this semester. The registration must be approved in advance by your advisor.

### Online Registration by Apr. 21

### Withdrawal by May 9

Obtain approval from the class instructor then submit the cancelation form to the Student Exchange Division.

Make sure to keep at least 15 credits

# IPLA Final Presentation Screening Criteria

### 1. Achievement of academic goals/留学の目的と設定した課題の目標達成

Is the student able to state clearly and concretely the achievement of the objectives set at the start of the study abroad and the documents that provide evidence of the learning outcomes?

"Is the student able to explain the acquisition of specialized knowledge and the development of intercultural competence?"

# 2. Self-development through study-abroad experience/留学を通した自己成長

"Are the students able to explain how they were able to overcome the difficulties they faced during their study abroad and how they were able to grow, as well as their future prospects, in relation to their study abroad experience?"

# 3. Concreteness and clarity of presentation materials/発表資料の具体性および明瞭さ

"Are students able to present their presentation in a way that is understandable to those who were not able to attend the screening session?"






### How to enter the IPLA Classroom


- 1. Log into Google with your Tohoku University DC mail address.
- 2. You can find the "Classroom" icon in the Google menu.








3. Select a Classroom from "+" and enter the class code "7szagm2".








4. Alternatively, you can join the IPLA Classroom through the email invitation you received in your DC email.

## Peer-Support

### **Tutor**

Every student is assigned to a buddy, who will help you adjust to campus life at Tohoku University and be your friend.

#### **★**You can:

- Practice your Japanese /review lessons together
- Ask for assistance when settling down
- Continue getting to know each other and hang out as a friend

### To maintain good friendship

- Meet your partner regularly. In order to do so, you both need to make the meeting as part of your routine. Ex)
   Set up a "fixed time" to meet.
- Be on time when you meet. If you will be late for an appointment, notify your partner right away. Avoid a last minute cancelation.
- Be reminded that you two do not share a mother tongue.
   In order to avoid misunderstanding, ask for clarification and be patient.
- Use writing to confirm your next meeting day and time to avoid miscommunication.
- Your tutor may not be able to help you every time you need help because the tutor is also a student. Respect each other's schedule and priority.
