It examines the theories, policies, and practices aimed at promoting economic growth, poverty reduction, and human development in these nations. Students will gain a comprehensive understanding of the key issues, theories, and empirical evidence in the field of development economics.

Examine Policy Interventions: Study the role of government policies, international aid, trade, and institutions in promoting economic development. 3. Evaluate Empirical Evidence: Analyze real-world case studies and empirical evidence to assess the effectiveness of development policies and strategies. Develop critical thinking skills to evaluate the ethical, social, and economic implications of development policies.
