Class Subject	国際問題プレゼンテーション Making Presentations on International Affairs		
Class Objectives and Summary	<p>この講座の目的は、プレゼンテーションの技術を学びながら、国際問題についての知識を深めていくことにある。今日の国際社会には、さまざまな問題が山積みになっている。世界各地で国家間の安全保障をめぐる緊張がつづき、テロや過激派の活動も広がっている。だが、国際協力に向けた動きもある。貿易や投資、人権、環境といった領域において、各国は連携を深めている。この講座では、受講生によるプレゼンテーションを通じて、これらの問題に関する互いの理解を深めていく。</p> <p>The aim of this course is to gain comprehensive knowledge of international affairs while learning presentation skills. In today's global society, a number of challenges persist. Security tensions between states are on the increase in various parts of the world, and disruptive activities of terrorists and extremists are spreading across the globe. Yet cooperative efforts are also emerging. In particular, international institutions have been established, in areas such as trade, investment, human rights, and the environment. On the basis of the presentations made by students, this course aims to promote mutual learning among them on these latest developments.</p>
