

1. Nihongo ID Application/Class Registration



※ You require a Nihongo ID and certificate for the current term to take classes. You cannot use your Nihongo ID from the previous term.



2. This program's placement test waiver system is described below.

In the Japanese Language Education Program students undergo a placement test at the beginning of the term and take classes appropriate to their level. However, students taking classes for consecutive terms may take classes one level higher than their current level in the following term without retaking the placement test if they meet the conditions in the table below (note that the following conditions pertain to grades obtained within a single semester and do not apply to grades acquired over multiple semesters).

Continuing JYPE, COLABS, and IPLA students

-Continuing students who are Level 1 to 3 ONLY may proceed to the next higher "Tentative" level with "B" or "C" grades for the conditions shown in the table above.

-Students of all levels who obtained grades of "C" or higher in the previous term CANNOT register/take the same classes again in the following term.

Students in Intensive Learning Classes

If you obtain a grade of "A" or better in C150 or C250, you may take classes that are one difficulty level higher than your current level in the second half of the term. If you obtain a grade of "B" or "C" in C150 or C250, you may take the next higher "Tentative" difficulty level but only if you will continue taking the class in the second half of the term.

6. Eligibility for Classes

Classes that can be taken at each level are as follows.

- ※ If your level is marked "Tentative," you may register for classes both at your tentative level, and one level below. (E.g. if you are "Level 4 (Tentative)," you may register for both Level 4 and Level 3 classes at the same time.)
- ※ Those JYPE, COLABS, or IPLA student who are judged to be "Tentative" 2, 3, or 4 level have to decide whether to enroll in classes EITHER in your tentative level OR one level below. You cannot register for classes both at your tentative level and one level below at the same time (for example, if you are "Level 4 (tentative)," you must choose whether to register for Level 3 classes or Level 4 classes). Those JYPE, COLABS, or IPLA student who are judged to be "Tentative" 5 or 6 level may enroll in classes in your tentative level and those one level below simultaneously (for example, if you are "Level 6 (tentative)," you may enroll in Level 5 classes and Level 6 classes simultaneously).

4. If a two-letter code appears in the "Other" section, the class is a seminar. These are Intercultural Collaborative Learning, except for classes marked CL, HS, and NS International and Japanese students take Intercultural Collaborative Learning together. They participate in discussions and cooperative projects to deepen their intercultural understanding. Special auditing students, non-degree students, undergraduate students, and graduate students can receive credit for Intercultural Collaborative Learning if they register them as General Education subjects. 




