Object and summary of class	<p>Modern Japan started as a constitutional monarchy and was gradually taken over by militant authoritarianism(totalitarianism). How did this transformation occur? What were the prominent features of the state and society during the era of militant authoritarianism. What kind of effect did those features have on Japan's post-war democracy? What kind of similarities and differences can we find between Japan's pre-war authoritarianism and other Asian authoritarianism such as contemporary China?</p> <p>This seminar aims to deal with these questions by reading and analyzing a classic monograph written by Masao Maruyama who was a prominent scholar on Japanese political thought in the post-war era. The main purpose of this course is to provide an opportunity for undergraduate and master's program students who are willing to improve their English academic skills(critical analysis, presentation, discussion).</p>
Goal of study	Developing a comparative framework for analyzing the relationship of authoritarianism and democracy. Improving skills regarding critical analysis, academic presentation and constructive debate which are all essential for academic communication.
Contents and progress schedule of the class	<p>This seminar will deal with 9 chapters of the text book in 15 classes.</p> <p>In each class, 3 students will give a presentation regarding the content of the assigned chapter. After the 3 presentations, the students who didn't give a presentation will be required to make comments and ask questions.</p> <p>At the end of the semester, each students will prepare a presentation in which they will share their overall evaluation of the text book.</p> <p>Students will be require to give multiple presentations and participate in each week's discussion.</p>
Record and evaluation method	Attendance rate(20%), presentation dealing with chapters of the text book(40%), final presentation(20%), contribution to discussion in class(20%).
