About the Program

The 10-day program will enable students from diverse backgrounds and cultures to enhance their leadership skills and cross-cultural competency through a series of workshops, discussions, field trips and cultural activities.

Participants will learn critical problem-solving skills through design thinking, a concept developed at the University of Sydney to solve complex problems across many disciplines.

The program also includes sessions on the new area of Planetary Health, focusing on sustainable and ethical food systems, and

Innovation and Entrepreneurship.

Group projects will allow students to work together to propose solutions to real world problems currently affecting the Asia Pacific region.
