Malaysia is also a country famous for its delicious food where the spices use to prepare the meal can be mouth-watering. In Malaysia, the common language used by the locals is Malay language. Malaysian are also able to speak well in English for any international interaction and are frequently used in university lectures. The Weather in Malaysia exhibits a tropical type without extremely hot temperature. Throughout the year, the average weather temperature range between 20C to 30C. The main rainy season at the west region of Malaysia is in August while as for the east region will be in November until February.

Female



Do Wear

- 1. Button up dress shirt
- Neck-tie of the appropriate length (tie should touch the top of your belt)
- 3. Tasteful suit jacket
- 4. Dress slacks (clean and pressed)
- 5. Polished dress shoes

Do Wear

- 1. Business suits
- 2. Skirts: the length should hit just above the knee or below
- 3. Slacks: neatly pressed, nothing too tight
- Blouses: Dressy styles or buttondown shirts paired with a cardigan, tucked in
- 5. Dresses: worn alone, or with a suit jacket or blazer
- 6. Shoes: closed-toe, polised, scuff free
- 7. Jewellery: tasteful, not overdone

Don't Wear

- 1. Short sleeve button-up shirt with a tie
- 2. Casual pants
- 3. Casual leather shoes
- 4. Wrinkled or soiled clothing
- 5. White socks

Don't Wear

- Anything too short, too revealing, too tight or too sheer
- 2. Blouses that are sleeveless or low-cut
- 3. Casual khaki pants (neutral or khaki coloured dress slacks are fine)
- 4. Open-toed or overly casual shoes, or extremely high heels

Guideline: Free Attire

Male

Do Wear

- 1. Button up or polo style dress shirt
- 2. Casual pants (clean and neatly pressed)
- 3. Sweaters
- 4. Casual and clean leather shoes

Female



Do Wear

- Casual pants, including cropped pants and caprls that hit around midcalf
- Skirts and dresses in a more casual style and in appropriate length
- 3. Button-up shirts, blouses or sweaters
- 4. Open-toed shoes, including dress sandals

Don't Wear

- 1. T-shirts
- 2. Jeans or cargo pants
- 3. Tennis shoes or sandals
- 4. Wrinkled or soiled clothing
- 5. Pants without a belt

Don't Wear

- 1. T-shirts
- 2. Jeans, including coloured styles
- 3. Shorts, even shorts that reach the knees
- 4. Beach wear or street wear shoes, like flip-flops or sneakers
- Casual sundresses (a light cardigan or jacket over a sleeveless piece is easy fix)

Guideline: Misc.

Visa

All delegates are responsible for their own visas. Please check if you are required to apply an entry visa to enter Malaysia. However, for most ASEAN countries, you may obtain Visa on Arrival at the immigration. Kindly show your printed Letter of Acceptance (LoA) and printed return flight ticket to the immigration officers. Organising committee is not responsible if you fail to obtain an entry visa to Malaysia. The expiry date of your passport should be less than 6 months prior to arrival at KLIA.

Security

- 1. You are not allowed to change rooms with your firends without permission from organising committee.
- We highly discourage members of the opposite gender to meet each other inside the hotel rooms. Delegates are only recommended to meet in the lobby or public areas.

Prohibition

Smoking, drinking and gambling are strictly prohibited at all times in the hotel and inside UTP campus.

Electricity

In Malaysia, the power sockets are type G (3-pin plug socket). The standard voltage is 240 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz. Kindly bring your own 3-pin plug connector to charge your devices.
