Application Deadline

Partner universities need to discuss the number of students before the nomination and should email nominated students' information to OIA before sending the original documents.

- Spring Semester: December 1st
- Fall Semester: June 1st

How to apply

Submit the required documents of the below, to person in charge of overseas study programs at your home university.
Documents then should be sent to here via your home university's personnel by deadlines.

All documents should be written in English or Korean.

- Application form
- Academic Transcript in English
- Certificate of Registration in English
- Copy of Passport
- ID photo(Background color should be white,size:3.5cm x 4.5cm)
- Proof of Language Proficiency(Optional) : Korean/English

Eligibility

Exchange students must be nominated by CU's partner universities.
Exchange students must be full-time students in one of CU partner universities and have completed at least 1 semester of study at home university.

Language Requirement

Students are not required to provide proof of language proficiency, but they have to have eligibility or ability of Korean skills in order to take regular courses in CU. Or, Students can take Korean language classes.

Medical Insurance Requirements

It is required for exchange student to register medical insurance.
We suggest exchange students buying an insurance that we proposed, when they get arrived here, so that we can take care of them immediately in case of emergency.
Or, students have to get it in their home country and bring a copy of the policy showing his/her name upon arrival to OIA.
The documents must be accompanied with an English translation.

Living Information

Housing

All incoming exchange students can apply for the on-campus housing, but the division type shall not be guaranteed.

- Male and Female housing are separated
- Division type : Global House/Baek-hak Haksa/Green Village
- Housing Fee(unit: Korean Won) *Meals are not included
