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#### ABOUT GLOBAL LEADERSHIP ENGLISH CHALLENGE

#### 2-1. GLEC India

'Global Leadership English Challenge (GLEC)' is an English Speech and Essay Writing Contest on the topics of the United Nations and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). With the world facing seemingly unresolvable matters, which range from environmental issues to refugee crises, GLEC aims to raise awareness and understanding of contemporary global issues of the participating students. Participants are expected to share their views on current issues and offer potential solutions to multifaceted global problems on the given themes based on their grade level.

Participants will go through two stages (preliminary round and final round) in their respective countries, and the final round winners will be invited to participate in the **GLEC Global Conference**, a four-day international academic conference on the UN and SDGs. Participants in the Global Conference will meet and exchange with UN high officials, scholars, ambassadors, international organization experts, and participating students from other countries. Through these events, GLEC will work as a stepping stone for participating students who wish to be future leaders in solving global challenges.

## 2-2. Global GLEC Conference (Vietnam, China, Japan, India, etc)

'Global GLEC Conference (GGC)' is an international academic conference where worldwide GLEC winners from Korea, Vietnam, India, China, and Japan, and talented students from each country interact with one another. Participants from all around the globe will be able to seek methods of cooperation on the international agenda through lectures of UN experts and team debates related to Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In addition, students are expected to develop capacity as global citizens through opportunities to cultivate global leadership, exchange or experience various cultures and develop their future careers through presentation training and career development sessions. Winners of 2021 Global Leadership English Challenge are qualified to participate in the GGC.

Track	Topics	
Elementary School	According to the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA), the Covid-19 pandemic has widened the disparities and inequities within and between countries in ability to cope and recover. For example, the most developed countries have on average 55 hospital beds, over 30 physicians, and 81 nurses per 10,000 people, compared to 7 hospital beds, 2.5 physicians, and 6 nurses in the least developed country.  The Sustainable Development Goal 3 – Good Health and Well-Being aims to achieve universal health coverage. What do you think wealth-nations could contribute to undeveloped nations to reduce the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic?	
Middle School	According to the United Nations Secretary-General's Policy Brief, the Covid-19 pandemic has created the largest disruption of education systems in history, affecting nearly 1.6 billion learners in more than 190 countries and all continents. Closures of schools and other learning spaces have impacted 94 per cent of the world's student population, up to 99 per cent in low and lower-middle income countries.  The <b>Sustainable Development Goal 4 – Quality Education</b> aims to prevent a learning crisis for just, equal, and inclusive peaceful societies. How does the Covid-19 pandemic impact young students' education rights and their educational environment in achieving quality education? What do you think should be preceded to reach SDG 4? Use specific reasons and examples to support you answers.	
High School	There have been two different views on the impact of the Covid-19 on the global environment. The head of the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) has cautioned that the improved air quality or reduced greenhouse gas emissions achieved amidst the Covid-19 are positive but temporary. On the other hand, the Emissions Gap Report 2020 has indicated that the <b>Sustainable Development Goal 13 - Climate Action</b> as part of the Covid-19 recovery can bring the world closer to the Paris Agreement goal.  Many member states of the United Nations have pledged their carbon neutrality in a certain year, and how do you think nations can ensure both sustainable economic growth and GHG (Green House Gas) reduction?	





## University

The Sustainable Development Goal 8 – Decent Work and Economic Growth aims to promote inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment, and decent work for all. 'Sustainable Development Outlook (SDO) 2020' indicated that the Covid-19 stagnated economic growth, and the decline in Gross World Product led to an additional significant unemployed worldwide. 'The Sustainable Development Goals Report 2020' also highlighted that the coronavirus has caused abrupt and profound changes, having an adverse impact on the world's labor markets, particularly on workers in informal employment, the self-employed, daily wage earners, and workers in sectors at the highest risk of disruption.

Discuss the challenges of the worsening impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on the timely achievement of goal 8 of the SDGs and present your view on what should be done to address these challenges including how to address the deteriorating problems of youth unemployment.
